Quentin Blake	Quentin Blake was born in London in 1932 and has drawn ever since he can remember. He has written and illustrated over 300 books. He illustrated 18 of Roald Dahl's books.

Vocabulary – linked to English	
Noun	A noun is a name of a person, place, thing or feeling.
Adjectives	An adjective is a word that describes a noun, e.g. The red ball bounced.
Expanded noun phrase	An expanded noun phrase contains a noun and at least one adjective, e.g. The ginormous green dragon roared.
Play script	A play script is a piece of writing written for the stage. It is written to be performed.
First person	Written from the point of view of the writer. This type of writing will include word such as I, me and we .
Third person	The writer describes something that is happening to someone else. You will often find the words they, he and she
