Vocabulary		
Development	refers to change and growth	
Facilities	are places or buildings with a specific purpose, like schools or hospitals, parks	
Industrial revolution	is a period of major change where people started using machines and factories instead of making goods by hand,	
Market town	a small town in the countryside, that has a regular market	
Natural resources	are materials or substances produced by the environment that humans find useful	
Population	the number of people living in a certain area	
Port	a docking place for ships on the coast of the ocean, a river, or a lake	
Services	any activity that fulfills a human want or need and returns money to those who provide it	
Settlement	a place where people live, ranging from a single dwelling to a large city	
Site	describes the physical characteristics of the location	


