

## Maths in KS2


- In two sets

## **Times Tables**.


There is a statutory government times tables test at the end of lower key stage 2 (Summer term of Year 4) of all the times tables up to x 12.


Please encourage your child to practice on TTRS regularly as this will greatly help with their times table fluency.








## **READING**

We expect your child to read every day for at least 10 minutes. All children will now have a reading record and book. Please make sure that your child brings them in each day. When they have read their book, they then take responsibility for putting their read book in the tray and choosing another from the same level.



New spelling rules are taught every Friday and spellings are set on here to practice throughout the week. We will have a weekly spelling check every Friday morning of these words. We practice these very regularly in school, including going on spelling shed, with emphasis on the rule taught. Please encourage your child to practice these regularly at home.
