EYFS	Discuss what they can see, touch, smell, hear or taste. Describe and explain what they have done. Identify and classify things they observe. Ask and answer some scientific questions. Record using pictures and captions. Record using non-standard units, charts and tables.
Early Learning Goals	
Year 1	Use simple equipment to help make observations. Explain what they have done. Give a reason for their answer.

Vocabulary

Charter	A set of rights or rules that a group can follow.
Knowledge	To learn and understand information. This is often gained through experience.
Investigate	To study by looking carefully. This is systematic and questions are asked.
Challenge	To take on a task that is demanding. To disagree with your opponent.
Our World	The earth and all the people and things living upon it.
Universe	The system of created things.
Curiosity	An eager desire to learn. This is often when something is strange or unusual.
Transport	To carry from one place to another
Wheel	A round frame that turns on an axle.
Senses	Five ways to understand and experience our surroundings. The senses are touch, smell, taste, sight and hearing.
Systematic	To use an order, method or plan to carry out an action.
